Head of The Ahmadiyya Muslim Community Delivers Eid Sermon in London

> "Become firmer in your faith and be mindful of fulfilling the rights of one another. This is the lesson taught to us by this Eid of Sacrifice" – Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad

The World Head of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community, the Fifth Khalifa (Caliph), His Holiness, Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad, delivered the Eid-ul-Adha sermon on 12th August 2019 from the Baitul Futuh Mosque in London.

During the address, His Holiness spoke about the essence of true sacrifice. His Holiness also spoke about the purpose of sacrificing an animal and why Muslims are advised to do so during Eid-ul-Adha.

His Holiness began his address by quoting chapter 22, verse 38of the Holy Quran which reminds Muslims about the importance of understanding why they sacrifice an animal.

Explaining the verse, Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad said:

"God Almighty has stated that righteousness is the true essence that should underlay any sacrifice of animals we make. This is what is beloved to God. By making the physical sacrifice, the person making the sacrifice expresses his willingness to forego all his personal desires for God... The person making the sacrifice should take a lesson from this act of sacrificing an animal and realise that he too should be willing to make every sacrifice of his personal desires for the greater goal of achieving the nearness and pleasure of God Almighty."

Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad said:

"These physical sacrifices that we make are there in order to shake our spirit, to make it realise that just as this animal was sacrificed for our use, a true believer should be ready to make every sacrifice, following the commandments of God. Prepare both your physical and spiritual selves for making sacrifices and elevate your standards of righteousness."


Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad said:


Head of Ahmadiyya Muslim Community Delivers Special Message on Occasion of 'Khilafat Day' [28th May 2014]



Today's Friday sermon was delivered by Khalifatul Masih V (May Allah be his Helper) from Baitul Futuh mosque, London. After Tashahhud and Surah Fātiḥah Huzoor said :

We are passing through the Islamic month of Rabi-ul Awal. In the Islamic world, especially in the Muslims of Indo Pak, this month is of utmost importance. It is significant for the entire Muslim world but it is celebrated with much zeal in the sub-continent. On the 12th day of Rabiul Awal, the Holy Prophet was born. This is according to one research. But Hazrat Bashir Ahmad Sahib has written in his book "Seerat Khatamun Nabiyeen" that according to an Egyptian scholar, the Holy Prophet's date of birth is the 9th day of Rabi-ul Awal. Whatever the case is, in this month our chief and master Muhammad (saw) came to this world. However, how unfortunate is the condition of today's Muslims that they commemorate this day to celebrate the birth of Prophet Muhammad (sa) who was the mercy for all mankind but in reality they are personification of "their hearts are divided." (59:15)

It would be one thing if they were committing such acts for the fulfilment of their own desires. But the issue here is that they are doing all this in the name of Allah and his Prophet (sa). A Muslim is killing other Muslims in the name of Allah and his Prophet (sa).
